If you signed up for the Quick Shop location, meal kits will be provided on Thursdays 1:30pm-2:00 pm across from Thoroughbred Plaza. Capacity is limited at this location. Meals are first come, first served.

REGISTRATION: Thank you to everyone who pre-registered! Your early registration helps us plan meals and gather the USDA-required information. Didn't pre-register? No worries—on-site registration will be available!

MEAL DISTRIBUTION: Meals are available for all children ages 18 and under. If a child is not present, meals can only be picked up by a parent or guardian. Meals will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. *Thank you for your patience as we manage traffic and registration!*

MEALS AT A GLANCE: Meals will include the required components for 7 breakfasts and 7 lunches. One gallon of 1% milk or shelf stable milk will be provided.
